COMMUNITY **SCHOOLS**

No increase in separate funding

Foundation Aid includes a set aside for community schools which is increased by \$50 million, but enforcement capacity to ensure these funds go to community schools is weak – proposed by Governor Cuomo.

5 Year Moratorium on new charter schools

and decouple state aid increases to education from mandatory tuition increases that districts are required to pay to charter schools.



CHARTER SCHOOLS

\$80 million increase for charter tuition across the state - about a 4% increase

plus a \$22.6 million increase for New York City charter tuition, proposed by Governor Cuomo.

Maintain local control of school districts

Maintain the principle of local control with oversight of the New York State Board of Regents.



GUBERNATORIAL CONTROL

Unprecedented new power for Governor to withhold school aid

unless Governor's office and Commissioner of Education approve local school budget. Proposed by Governor Cuomo and opposed by Commissioner of Education.

Funding for supportive schools

including funding for teacher diversity and and \$50 million for My Brother's Keeper (MBK) initiative.



SCHOOL CLIMATE

Provides \$2 million for the Supportive Schools Grant

plus \$500,000 for teacher diversity, and maintains MBK funding, thanks to the efforts of the State Assembly.

\$150 million for expansion of access to 3- and 4-year-olds



PRE-K

\$15 million for expansion of access
