In 2019, New Yorkers demand the legislature overhaul New York's pretrial system, decarcerate jails, and both adequately and equitably distribute funding for our public schools.

EDUCATION EQUITY

New York State has a funding formula that was created out of the demand for equity and adequacy, but currently the State owes students \$4.1 billion in unpaid aid for schools. Education justice requires adequate and equitably distributed funding for our public schools. It is time that the state fully funds the Foundation Aid formula.
